The STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW ENGLAND resembles another map--known to Pennsylvania anglers as the "Lost Stream Map."

It was completed in 1965 after a 30 year effort by Howard Higbee, a former Penn State Professor.

Professor Higbee painstakingly plotted by hand, the location of 45,000 miles of streams onto the map. It sold extremely well - until the printer declared bankruptcy and hauled Higbee's work to the landfill.

But reprints were impossible because the maps were printed in non-photographic blue. Higbee was even offered \$400 for one of his last maps. And state agencies were forced to keep their copies under lock and key.

Then, at the age of 91, Howard Higbee's dream came true. Computers made it possible to reprint the map.

Then the STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW ENGLAND was created.

Finalists in all categories and grade levels will be honored at a special awards ceremony to be held in May at the Connecticut Science Center in Hartford. Winners will receive a certificate and a gift card.

Hamden's Warming Center at Keefe Community Center, Through March 29

The Town of Hamden, in partnership with Columbus House, Inc., will open an overnight winter warming center for those experiencing homelessness in our community.

Hamden's Warming Center is now open through March 29th, from 7pm-7am, seven (7) nights a week. It will be stationed at the Keefe Community Center Gym, located at 11 Pine Street. Please enter through the George Street parking lot, located at 19 George Street.

The warming center is not a "shelter" as no beds will be provided. It will offer a clean, safe, indoor overnight space to protect those in need from harsh weather conditions for those who would likely otherwise spend their nights outdoors. The warming center will be operated by trained Columbus House staff who will monitor overnight shifts and share community outreach information with our guests. Hamden Police will provide walk-throughs on a nightly basis.
