The North Haven Republican Town Committee is again sponsoring "Honor Them with a Flag", a fundraiser to benefit the American Legion Post 76. It is a salute to our country's military personnel, veterans and first responders. The public is invited to participate by purchasing a U.S. flag dedicated to a member of our military, first responder or anyone else close to your heart. The flags will go on display on the Town Green from the weekend before Veterans Day on Sunday, November 8, and displayed until November 29.

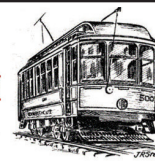
