

****LEGAL NOTICE****
JANUARY 2026 MUNICIPAL TAXES
DUE TO THE TOWN
OF NORTH HAVEN FOR THE 2024
GRAND LIST
(Pursuant to C.G.S. § 12-145)

REAL ESTATE & PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES for the Town of North Haven are due JANUARY 1, 2026 (SECOND INSTALLMENT). Further, SUPPLEMENTAL MOTOR VEHICLE TAXES, if applicable to you, are due JANUARY 1, 2026 (IN-FULL). Supplemental bills are issued pursuant to C.G.S. § 12-7. **NOTE: FAILURE TO RECEIVE A BILL DOES NOT INVALIDATE THE TAX (C.G.S. § 12-130). BILLING STUBS FOR THE SECOND HALF OF BOTH REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES DUE IN JANUARY WERE INCLUDED IN THE JULY BILLING PACKET; WE DO NOT PROCESS A SECOND BILL.**

If taxes are not paid by end of the grace period, February 2, 2026, the taxes will become delinquent as of February 3, 2026: Interest will accrue at the rate of 1½ % per month or fraction thereof (18% per annum) on all unpaid taxes on the 2024 Grand List, computed from the original due date of January 1, 2026. Each addition of interest (*minimum amount of \$2.00, per CT State law*) shall become due and collectable and shall be figured on the original amount of tax. **INTEREST CANNOT BE WAIVED (C.G.S. §§ 12-145 & 146).**

If BACK TAXES are due, payments will be applied to the oldest outstanding bill first; fees, interest, and liens will be paid before principal (if applicable). (C.G.S. § 12-144b). All delinquent motor vehicle taxes requiring a release for motor vehicle registration should be paid by cash, bank check or money order. Payments made with a check and/or online require a ten (10) business day hold for clearance, which will delay your ability to register with DMV. **IF YOU ARE NOT SURE OF THE PROPER PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING A DMV RELEASE, PLEASE CONTACT THE OFFICE BEFORE YOU COME IN TO PAY.**

The Tax Collector's office accepts the following forms of payment: Cash, Personal Check, Money Order, Bank Check and Certified Bank Check. **We do NOT accept debit or credit cards in the office.** Please be mindful of the fact that while we accept cash, we do reserve the right to accept cash in the limited amount of \$1,000.00 per transaction. Please make all checks payable to: Tax Collector, Town of North Haven.

PAYING BY MAIL: PLEASE INCLUDE THE APPROPRIATE PORTION OF THE BILL, AND WRITE THE LIST/BILL NUMBER [Example: 2024-MS-XXXXXXX] ON YOUR CHECK. **NO STAPLES PLEASE.** IF YOU PAY WITHIN THE GRACE PERIOD (**TIMELY PAYMENT**): FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE AN ENVELOPE HAS BEEN INCLUDED IN WHICH TO MAIL YOUR PAYMENT (**ADDRESSED TO: TAX COLLECTOR, TOWN OF NORTH HAVEN, P.O. BOX 900, HARTFORD, CT 06143-0900**). IF YOU PAY AFTER THE GRACE PERIOD (**LATE PAYMENT**): PLEASE MAIL YOUR PAYMENT TO THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE DIRECTLY, LOCATED AT MEMORIAL TOWN HALL, 18 CHURCH STREET, NORTH HAVEN, CT 06473. REQUESTS FOR RECEIPTS SHOULD INCLUDE A STAMPED, SELF-ADDRESSED ENVELOPE.

PAYING ONLINE: If you would like to pay your tax bill(s) online, please visit: www.northhaven-ct.gov in the section for ONLINE SERVICES: you will click on "VIEW AND PAY TAX BILLS ONLINE". Fees for the use of the online payment system will depend upon the payment instrument utilized: *checking & savings accounts, .50 fee per transaction; debit card, \$3.95 fee per transaction; and credit card, 3% fee per transaction.* Payments made after 8 p.m. weekdays will be considered processed no sooner than the next business day. Check your payment confirmation to be sure.

PAYING IN PERSON: The Tax Collector's office is open daily from 8:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., except for weekends and legal holidays.

Reminder on
Clearing Sidewalks

Wallingford: Mayor Vincent Cervoni has issued a reminder to all Wallingford residents, property owners, businesses and occupants of properties regarding their responsibility for the care of the abutting public sidewalks.

Municipal Ordinance #198-11 requires that snow and ice be removed from the sidewalk by the abutting property owner, following the end of the storm. Sidewalks must be cleared of any snow or ice, within eighteen (18) hours after the end of the storm. If the storm ends at night, the deadline for removal of any snow and ice will be eighteen (18) hours after sunrise. The minimum cleared

width of the path shall be three (3) feet. In no case shall snow from private property be deposited in the public roadway.

In the event that the ice cannot be removed, the property owner must make the sidewalk safe and passable, which may include the placement of sand or other suitable deicing materials.

Failure to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance can result in a \$25.00 per day fine for each day the snow is not removed and the actual cost for the Town to clear the sidewalk. The Police Department is authorized to issue notices and/or citations in this situation.
