SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED

The Connecticut Federation of Women's Clubs has announced two scholarships that are available to Connecticut women pursuing advanced courses of study at Institutions of higher learning. Awards are granted on the basis of future promise, scholastic ability and financial need.

The Dorothy E. Schoelzel memorial scholarship has a maximum award of \$2,000. Candidates must have completed three or more years of undergraduate work in an accredited institution with a 3.0 average or higher in the field of Education.

The Phipps scholarship has a maximum award of \$1,000. Candidates must have completed two or more years on undergraduate work in an accredited institution with a 3.0 average or higher toward a bachelor's or post graduate degree.

Completed applications, including general and personal information, a financial statement, instructor/employer references, official transcript of at least the most recent two years of undergraduate or graduate work **must be received by Feb. 10, 2025.**

New Collection Method for Bulk Trash in Hamden

The Town of Hamden has moved towards a new method of collecting residential bulk trash by appointment-only.

The appointment-only bulk trash pickup program took effect January 1st.

Moving forward, residents may receive one (1) free appointment-only bulk trash pickup between January 1, 2025 and June 30, 2025. Residents may receive two (2) free appointment-only bulk trash pickups within each of the subsequent contract years, from July 1 to June 30 of each year, e.g. July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 and so forth.

To receive a bulk trash pickup, Hamden residents should make an appointment by contacting All American Waste at (203) 503-

3782 no later than 1pm on the day prior to your regular trash collection day. Please place your bulk trash at the curb for collection before 6am.

All American Waste will maintain a record of all resident bulk trash pickup requests and will provide the Town with this information on a weekly basis.
