Hamden: Six members of the Quinnipiac community have received the university's highest honor as recipients of the 2024 Center for Staff and Faculty Excellence Awards.

"The awards represent the highest forms of excellence in teaching and service to students, and these six recipients tonight truly represent the best in our community that we are so proud of," said President Judy Olian. "You are a key reason that we are becoming The University of the Future."

Selected from 81 faculty nominations and 124 staff nominations, the honorees represent the very best of Quinnipiac's nearly 2,000 fulltime and part-time faculty and staff.

Coworkers, students and family members helped to celebrate the honorees during the 22nd annual presentation of the awards at the University Club

on October 22. The prestigious awards were presented to Grant Crawford, professor of mechanical engineering; Hilary Fussell Sisco, professor of public relations; Patricia Norberg, professor of marketing; Elizabeth Beaton, associate director of financial aid; Robert Joven, university librarian; and Tina Monteiro, manager of employee services.

"While all six of our faculty and staff shine in their respective roles, my admiration and gratitude go to every single member of the Quinnipiac family," said Olian. "All of you, in addition to these great six, make a difference in the lives of our students every single day. That's the uniqueness of the Quinnipiac climate and culture."

Interim Vice President of Human Resources Anna Spragg presented the 2024 Staff Excellence Awards and Provost Debra Liebowitz presented the 2024 Faculty Excellence Awards. Ahead of introducing the faculty honorees, Liebowitz said there is an important commonality among all six of the award recipients.

Wrong Location for QU Campus Expansion

Quinnipiac University is once again planning to expand their campus. This time into the residential neighborhood of upper Ridge Road near the intersection with Mt. Carmel Avenue.

The plan is to build an "Education Center" and a 94 car parking lot at 5100 Ridge Road that will be open from 7:00am-10:00pm 7 days a week. That is 15 hours a day, 7 days a week. This neighborhood and its families will be subjected to an endless stream of traffic and people. As a result of this endless stream of traffic and people, it is likely there will be increased noise, increased crime, increased automobile exhaust, increased trash, and increased safety concerns.

Even North Haven Police Chief Kevin J. Glenn in a letter dated October 3, 2024 stated, "In my professional opinion, I do not believe this project would be in the best interest of the surrounding residents and individuals traveling in the area. The increased traffic and a request for stop signs at a nearby intersection would create potential for vehicular accidents."

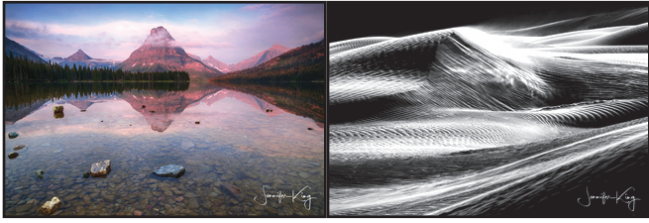

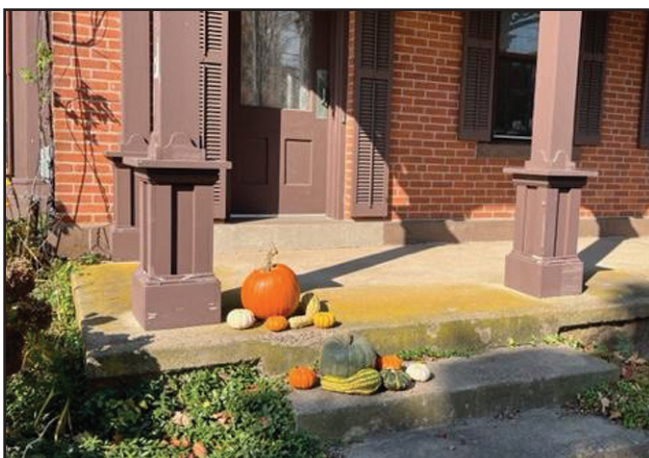

Question & Answer - Dr. Richard Durocher

Q: My toenails curve into the skin of my big toes and are very painful. When I cut them this condition keeps coming back. What can be done to prevent this from happening?

A: When cutting your toenails cut them straight across so you can see the corners, however, you should slightly round the corners so you do not cut yourself with the sharp edges. Be careful to cut the nail to the edge so as not to leave a pointed nail that may cut into the nail fold thus causing an ingrown toenail. Tight shoes and abnormally fleshy nail folds also contribute to the cause of ingrown toenails.

If you have an ingrown toenail border, you should have it removed as soon as possible so it does not get infected. This procedure is usually performed in the podiatrist's office under local anesthesia. The deformed nail border is removed giving immediate relief. If the condition is recurrent, consider having it permanently corrected by removing or stopping that part of the nail root from re-growing. Rest and elevation is required for several hours after the procedure. You can usually resume normal activities within 24 to 48 hours.

The Vikings, a formidable group of people who were conquerors, at times can only be described as being barbaric because of their brutality and truculent fighting. They were known to have plundered many cities of their riches, killed many people unreluctantly and kidnapped thousands of people over time to be enslaved, sold or traded to others.

The Vikings' travels carried them to many countries including Ireland, Sweden, England, Denmark and Greenland, and because they were great seafarers, an explorer named Leif Erickson landed in North America some 500 years before Christopher Columbus. There was one incident in which the Vikings put a siege on Paris in 845 A.D. and demanded 7,000 pounds of gold and silver before they agreed to leave. Their reign lasted some 300 years. Most of them perished because a volcano in South America blocked out the sun for a few years and therefore most succumbed to the cold and starvation.

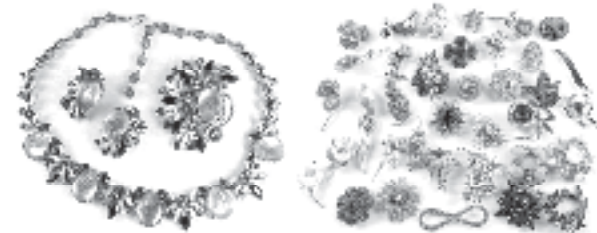

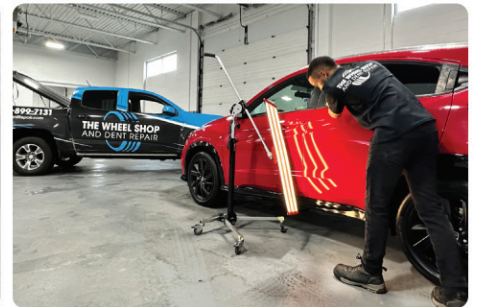
