North Haven: The Community Services Office is now welcoming North Haven residents to reserve their names for the 2024 Thanksgiving food distribution. Thanksgiving food pickup will take place on Mon., Nov. 25, from 10-11am in the gym of the Recreation Center, at 7 Linsley Street (next to Town Hall Annex). Parking will be available along Linsley Street, in the front circle of the recreation center and at the North Haven Congregational Church, 28 Church Street.

Please contact Rob Snurkowski in the Community Services office any time between 9am-4pm, Monday-Friday at (203) 239-5321 x502 to sign up. Requests must be received no later than 4pm on Fri., Nov. 22.

Currently, there is a need for: instant mashed potatoes, stuffing, turkey gravy, canned vegetables, canned cranberries, fruit cocktail and canned yams. Monetary donations are gladly accepted.

Beyond Thanksgiving, the food bank has a constant need for: mayonnaise, ketchup, mustard, coffee, tea, tuna, soup, any Chef Boyardee products, instant mashed potatoes, cookies, crackers, macaroni and cheese, protein bars, granola bars, trail mix, nuts, jerky, peanut butter crackers, graham crackers, dried fruit, fruit roll ups, fruit snacks, fruit cups, applesauce, pudding cups, peanut butter, jelly, pop tarts, cereal, oatmeal, pancake mix, syrup, fruit juice boxes and canned fruit.
