While composing each design, Heather offered many 'hints and tricks' to make the designs more interesting and to last longer. One hint was to keep designs to 3 colors, so one color will 'pop!' (Heather told us about picking up items

at tag sales or thrift shops to use as a base for floral designs.)

The dessert table floral design was created by Linda Burr of beautiful daffodils in a cute bunny vase. April dessert hostesses were Linda Thomas, Charlotte Nesdale, Peggy Murphy, Ann Cohen DePalma, Carol MacDonald, Jeanne Lawrence and Linda Burr.

Many garden club members also created floral designs expressing 'Blossom Time', theme for the design project coordinated by Shirley Lagerstrom, Design Chairperson. Beautifully done!
