Curbside Bulk Pickup Schedule

North Haven: First Selectman Michael J. Freda has announced that Field Operations (P.W.), will provide a two-week collection program for bulk items for the last two full weeks of September (Sept. 16-20; Sept. 23-27) that will be collected at the curb after the regular sanitation collection has been completed. Residents can place items at the curb by 5am on their designated trash collection day.

Bulk items include:

- Upholstered items (sofas, chairs, mattresses, box springs, love seats, sectionals and reclining chairs)
- Appliances or "white goods" (washers, dryers, refrigerators, ranges, and dish washers) Per state law doors must be removed
- Scrap metals (curtain rods, bicycles, metal tables, metal ladders, lawn mowers, metal grills, air conditioners, etc.)
- Vehicle tires (without rims), Sanitation will pick up 2 per week, per household

ENERGY ASSISTANCE 2024-2025 HEATING SEASON

This Office of Social Service energy assistance season will begin on October 1st for Northford and North Branford residents.

It is preferred that those that heat with a deliverable fuel such as oil, propane, or pellets are seen initially followed by utility heating customers. Utility heating customers should participate in a program offered by the utility company; there are several programs to choose from. The programs offered are medical protection, matching program, balance forgiveness and the like.

Information regarding programs offered by the utility companies is available in the Office of Social Service lobby. Although application appointments begin October 1 the program begins November 1, 2024.

There are two ways to apply, you may apply online beginning Sept. 1, following this link: <https://portal.ct.gov/dss/economic-security/winter-heating-assistance/energy-assistance---winter-heating/how-to-apply> or in this Office beginning Oct. 1.

You must bring to your appointment copies of your required documents. This office cannot make copies for you. Please bring all required documents. Applications cannot be completed without the required documents, incomplete documents will result in a delay or denial.

If you are interested in applying for Energy Assistance, you may call North Branford Social Service at (203) 484-6006 to make an appointment. A list of required documents needed to complete your application is available in both public libraries, online at

<https://www.northbranfordct.gov/252/Social-Services>, and the Stanley T. Williams Community Center, Social Service Lobby. There are significant changes to the program.

This program is based on income and not assets. This is not an entitlement program. The program is designed to assist persons offset the cost of heating during the winter months, weatherize the home as well as assist with a replace or repair of a non operating furnace or boiler. The program no longer offers a clean, tune and test of the furnace.

Public comments will be reviewed and included in the final CAPER which will then be submitted to HUD. The final CAPER will be available for viewing on the Town's web page after submission to HUD and will also be available in the Economic and Community Development Department.

Persons requiring translation services or persons with disabilities must contact the Town no less than three days in advance of viewing the draft CAPER, to request a summary of the draft CAPER in an accessible format.

North Haven Garden Club Junior Gardeners Update Week 12

North Haven: The Junior Gardeners Club members met at the garden at Faith United Methodist Church on Saturday August 24th. The kids started with picking what few vegetables were ripe enough - a handful of string beans, a few tomatoes that have started to ripen, two zucchini, three or four eggplants and some basil and parsley. During the week Ms. Maria picked some tomatoes that were starting to ripen and one well-done cucumber!

The squirrels continue to vex us in the tomato patch. We keep finding ripe tomatoes that have been bitten and left behind. It's so sad to see half-eaten tomatoes on the ground when we have worked so hard to grow our vegetables.

Ms. Julia and Ms. Maria brought in several wheelbarrows full of new

compost and dumped it in the back garden. Then the junior gardeners made two rows with the new compost and planted two varieties of lettuce and a whole row of kale. Since the weather is getting cooler, these crops should do very well...if we can keep the rabbits from eating the tender plants!

Elsewhere in the garden...Eric, James and Regina checked on the pumpkins, squash and watermelon. Everything still looks good, but needs more time to grow and ripen. Ms. Maria checked the potatoes and found two little potatoes popping out of the ground!! She covered them back up so they are not exposed to sunlight and will continue to grow. That is so exciting for our first time planting potatoes! We will have to keep covering them until they are ready to harvest, which will be after the plant has died and wilted (probably in October).

And we have a lot of butternut squash! Another great success for the JGC's first planting of but-

ternut squash. This is one of many winter squash varieties that makes for very hearty meals in the fall and winter. When you cut it open, it's orange inside (if it's ripe)! And there's lots of seed, which should be removed before cooking (and you can save them to plant next year!) Ms. Maria's favorite way to cook butternut squash is as squash soup, but I also like to cut it in half, scoop out the seeds and put sausage in the little hole, then bake it until the squash is tender (a knife can easily be inserted). You can drizzle maple syrup over it when it comes out of the oven or add a pat of butter and a sprinkle of cinnamon and it's ready to eat!
