Men and women's basketball defeat Bentley

On Saturday, Jan. 31, the university swept Bentley University as its men's and women's basketball teams earned NE10 conference victories. The men's team posted an 82-78 win to complete the program's first regular season defeat of the Falcons. Guard Justice Ellison, a graduate, scored a career-high 32 points and added 10 rebounds. Forward Cherif Diarra, a graduate, finished with 11 points, eight rebounds and seven assists, while forward Simon Percy, a junior, added 14 points. The women's team followed with 57-39 victory over Bentley as well. Forward Rheyna Steinauer, a senior, scored 21 points, and forward Tish Blackwood, a freshmen, recorded 18 points and 14 rebounds. The Owls held Bentley to 11 points in the second and third quarters. They stopped the Falcons 28-game winning streak and extended their own streak to nine games.
