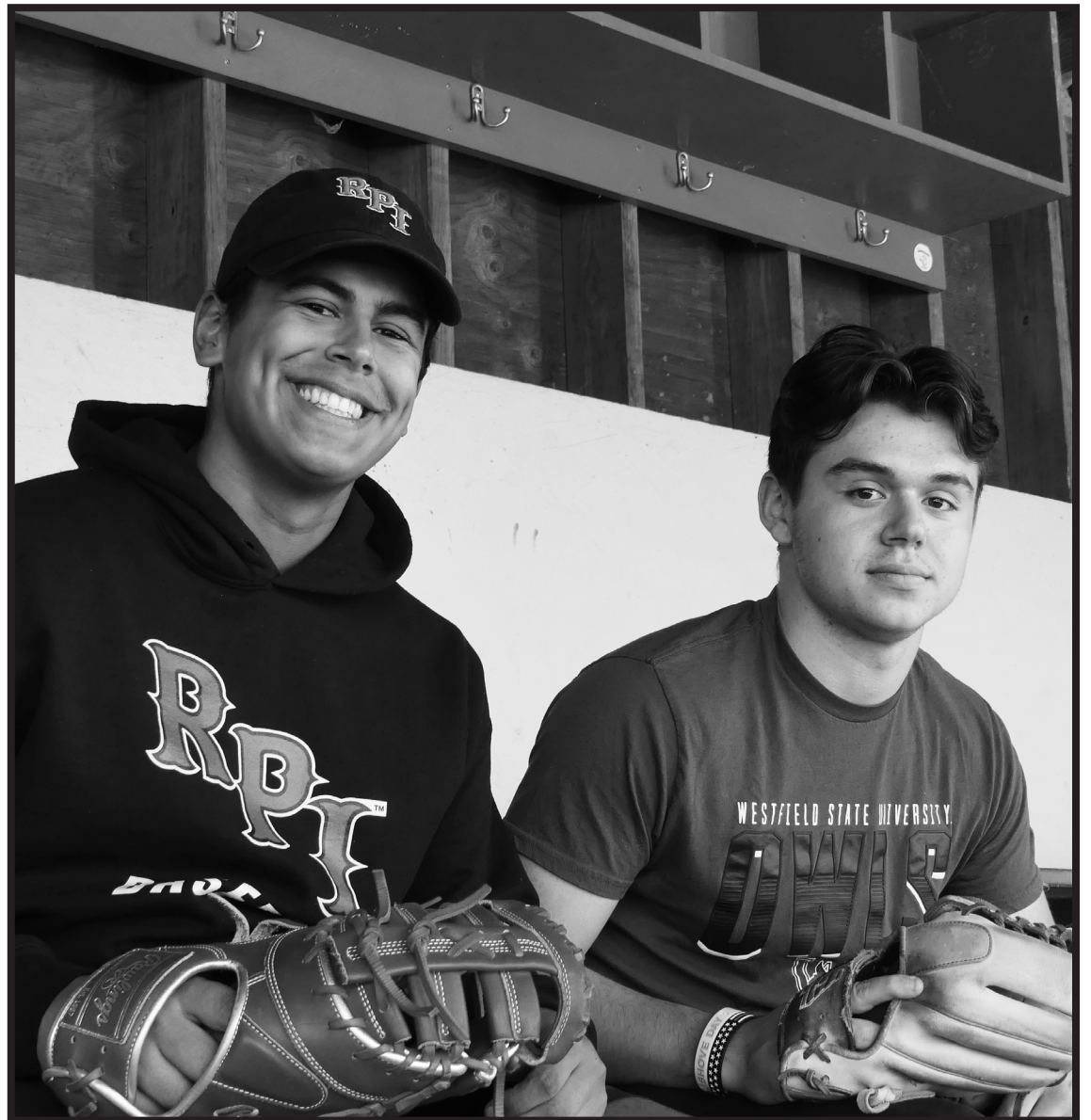
Hitlin was invited to visit campus in December of last year, and after that, he received his roster spot. After passing an academic pre-read with the admissions office to determine
