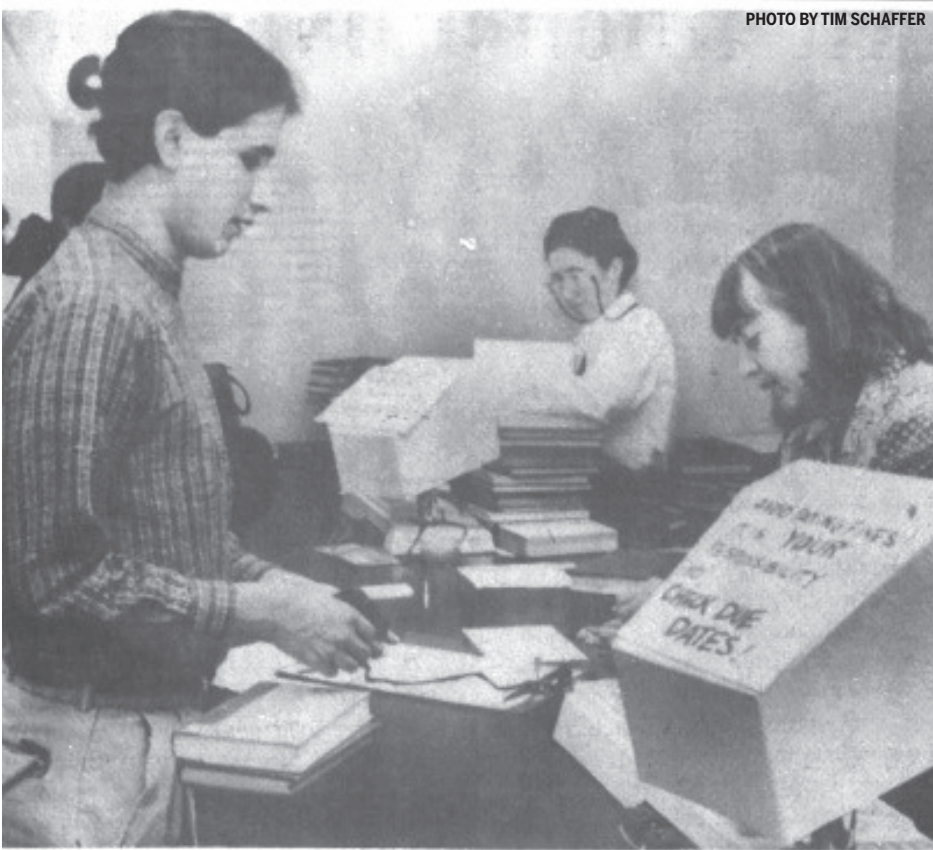
This Day in Yale History, 1991

September 5, 1991 / Unions, Administration Prepare for Tough Negotiations

The University’s latest series of cuts in dining hall facilities has exacerbated union-administration relations, setting the scene for a tough round of contract negotiations.

In less than two months, union officials and University administrators will approach the bargaining table to begin the first round of contract negotiation talks. Both contracts for Local 35, representing Yale’s 1,400 custodial and maintenance employees, and Local 34, representing the University’s 2,050 clerical and technical workers, expire Jan. 16.

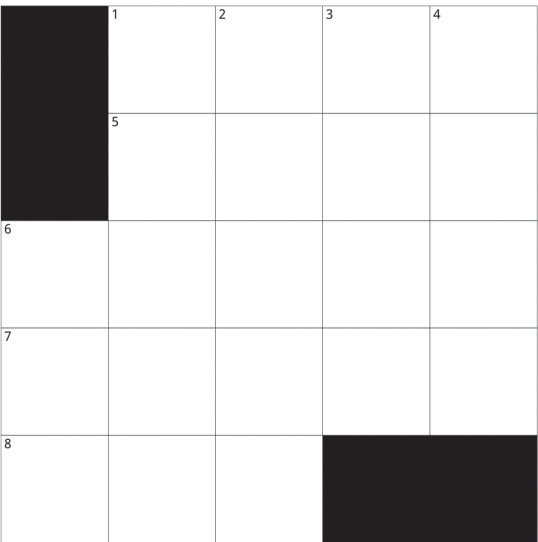

Leading Universities: Tales from the Trenches V & VI

Six Yale faculty members who started their administrative careers at Yale went on to head major universities: Cambridge, Duke, New York University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Oxford, and Yale. At the invitation of the Yale Henry Koerner Center, Richard Brodhead, Andrew Hamilton, Richard Levin, and Alison Richard shared their experiences as leaders in higher education last spring; and two, Susan Hockfield and Peter Salovey, will discuss their careers this fall. The Yale Center for British Art will host the upcoming Koerner Center lectures on the following dates. The lectures are free and open to the Yale community; advance registration is required.
