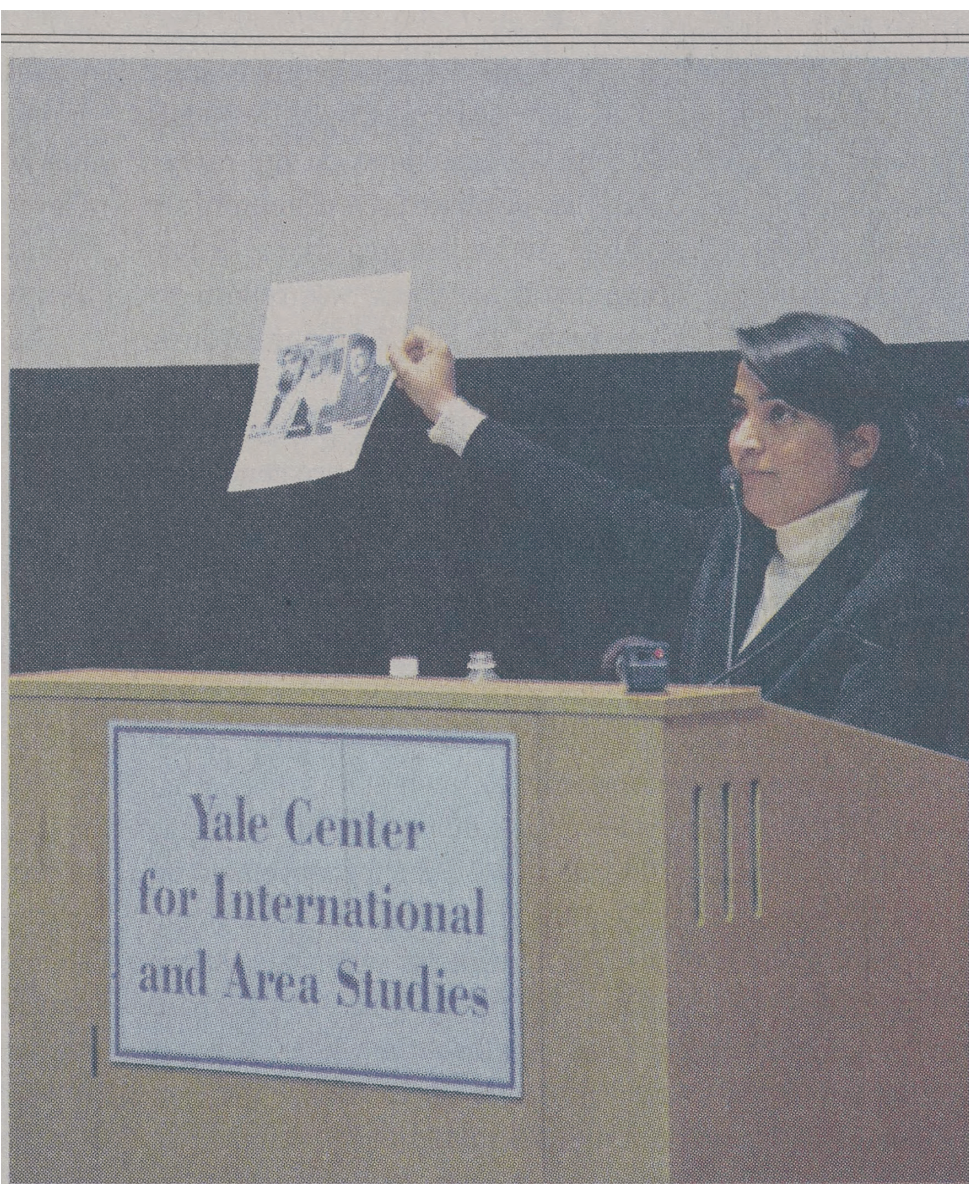
## This Day in Yale History, 2006

March 24, 2006 / Joya talks on Afghanistan, Hashemi

Female Afghan parliamentarian Malalai Joya criticized current U.S. policy in Afghanistan, as well as the presence of former Taliban spokesman and foreign ministry official Sayed Rahmatullah Hashemi as a special non-degree student at Yale, both during and after her speech, "Women's Rights, Warlords, and the U.S. Occupation of Afghanistan" on Thursday night.

The lecture, which was co-sponsored by the Yale Center for International and Area Studies and the Afghan Women's Mission, drew a full crowd in Luce Hall Auditorium and was preceded by a documentary film addressing women's rights in Afghanistan.

## Behind the Headline

When the News received a tip about a Zillow listing in Hamden with a closet of blue suits that looked uncannily like McInnis', I searched through Hamden property records to verify the connection. I found that McInnis' husband, Dean Johnson, was listed as the owner of the house set just over the Hamden-New Haven border. McInnis previously told us that she splits her time between the Yale president's official residence and a private home.

The News' archives have nearly a century and a half of stories about 43 Hillhouse, the president's official residence. Today, Hillhouse Avenue is almost entirely Yale-owned, with properties including the Jackson School, the Admissions Office, and the provost's house. When 43 Hillhouse was first built in 1871, its owner Henry Farnam (of Farnam Hall on Old Campus) was one of many professors who lived in the area. This transformation of Hillhouse, which had lost its neighborhood feel by the early 20th century, is part of what has led some presidents to split their time between the official house and a private residence.

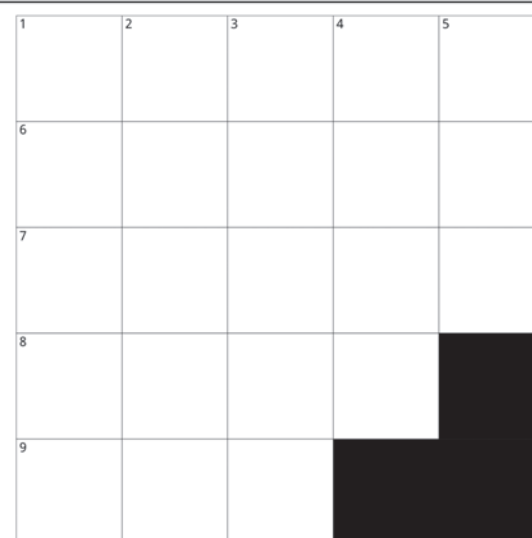
